Our "winter schedule" comes to an end after Easter. Over the course of the last year, we have had some good discussions about our church schedule. Traditionally, churches have a Sunday morning service, Sunday night service, and Wednesday night prayer meeting. Christians recognize that while this is "traditional" and has worked well, that schedule is not "inspired." For example, when I visit Jordan, Sunday is the first day of the work week, and believers can only meet for an evening service. At this point, our church family seems to benefit greatly from our Sunday AM service and our Wednesday Bible Study and children's programs. The Sunday PM service is the one we have asked, "Is there a better option?" It would not be right to abandon our service simply because people want more time for themselves, but if there is a more effective model, we should consider it. In our deacons and trustees and wives' meetings, we have studied several options. After much discussion, we decided the only way to know if there is a better way is to try. Thus, the "winter schedule." That, however, is not the only option. We have a couple of other possibilities and appreciate your patience as our church family enjoys learning and fellowshipping through some different schedules.
