Our missions program does not follow a man-made model. Wednesday night, in our mid-week					

service, we reviewed the model in Acts 13:1-4. The church in Antioch of Syria was active and had a multi-national congregation. Together, they were "ministering to the Lord." In the midst of their activity, the Holy Spirit asked them to "set apart" for a specific work, Saul (Paul) and Barnabas. These were men already active and an integral part of the church. God did not call everybody, but he called two leaders. They could easily have said, "No, we are busy already." Sometimes, God looks for those already busy to surrender to new opportunities. While looking at this passage, we can extract several principles applicable to local churches. Among them are these four lessons that we reviewed in our mid-week service.

- 1. Healthy churches (Christians) extend their vision beyond their own Surroundings.
- 2. The Holy Spirit calls missionaries out of local churches.
- 3. The Holy Spirit calls specific people.
- 4. The church is working cooperatively with the Holy Spirit.

Every believer is a missionary in his circle of influence. Paul and Barnabas worked with a team of people in their local church but God specifically chose them for another work. You can and should be involved now, but listen for God's direction when He calls you to serve in another field.
