Thank you for your faithful giving as part of our worship. The OT taught God’s people that the “tithes” was the starting place. The NT builds on the idea of people being stewards of God’s possessions. God owns everything. He simply chooses to entrust people with the care of His creation. Well-taught believers recognize that we will be stewards of resources for a few years. In those few years, we have guidelines from the Creator about how He wants His resources used. The OT makes it clear that good stewardship (giving – first fruits) is worship. God’s people are honoring Him when they invest in things that please the Father. The NT practice was to collect their offerings on the “first day of every week” (1 Cor. 16:2). The idea behind Paul’s words is that the church took offerings and was prepared for ministry opportunities. This text related to a gift they were sending to the persecuted believers in Jerusalem. The principle, though, is that consistent, grace-filled giving by the church family is foundational to effective ministry. I tell you this both to instruct and to thank our church family. Your consistent giving (tithes and offerings) has allowed our ministry to prosper in many ways.
